SFPD Youth Fishing Program

Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Friday, May 19th, 2006 3:48 PM - Lifesaving Award - West Point and Middle Point Roads - CS# 060 532 758 - Officers Petiti and Chantal were nominated for the Department's Lifesaving Award. On this date a woman ran into the police substation and told these officers that her husband is on the floor of their unit and not breathing. Officers Petiti and Chantal ran to the scene and discovered that the man did not have a pulse and began CPR. An ambulance was soon to arrive and took over the life saving duties. They discovered that the man now had a pulse due to the efforts of Officers Petiti and Chantal.

Wednesday, June 7, 2006, 12:00 AM, Oakdale and Rankin, Stolen Vehicle recovery and Parole violation (case # 060601604): Officer Olson was on patrol in the area of Oakdale and Rankin when he noticed that a large pickup truck had regular passenger car plates. He ran the plates through the DMV and found out that the plates belonged to a Mazda rather than a truck. Officer Olson stopped the truck and detained the driver. The first words out of the driver's mouth were, "It's stolen, isn't it." A DMV check revealed that the truck was stolen out of Oakland during a burglary; a warrant check revealed that the driver was on parole for auto theft. He was booked at Bayview Station on auto theft, stolen property and parole violation charges.

Wednesday, June 7, 2006, 9:30 AM, 4th and Market, Robbery with force (case # 060601604): Officers responded to the 2600 block of San Bruno on a report of a robbery. When they arrived, they met with the victim as well as the Principal of her school. The victim said that she was on her way to school, trying to catch the bus at 4th and Market when the suspect ran up behind her and took her purse. She chased after the suspect and was able to get some of her belongings back, but not before the suspect assaulted her. She called a friend who then called her school; the school sent a car to pick her up. While she didn't know the suspect's full name, she knew enough so that a local minister was able to help identify the suspect. Word got back to the suspect's parents who brought him into the station. victim responded to the station and formally identified the suspect who was then booked on robbery charges at Bayview Station.

Wednesday, June 7, 2006, 10:00 PM, 55 Ardath Court, Assault and warrant arrest (case # 060602828): Officers responded to Ardath Court on a report of a fight between a man and a woman involving a knife. When they arrived, they didn't find anyone fighting, but there was a blood trail to 55 Ardath. Knocks at the door went unanswered. Another officer who had responded to 55 Ardath earlier in the week advised responding officers that one of the occupants had a very large warrant for their arrest involving elder abuse. Because of the report of the fight and the blood trail leading into unit, entry was forced and two female occupants were detained. When asked why they didn't answer the door, one of the women said, "It ain't none of my business since it's her boyfriend."

In the mean time, SFGH Emergency reported that they had a stabbing victim that just arrived at the hospital. It turned out that the "victim" was a major Bayview gang member who just happened to be the boyfriend of one of the women now detained. The "victim" refused to talk to police and just told them to leave him alone.

Both women were taken to Bayview Station. The girlfriend was booked on domestic violence charges as well as delaying the police. The other woman was booked on the elder abuse warrant and delaying.

Wednesday, June 7, 2006, 10:00 PM, 900 block of Wisconsin, Robbery with firearm (case # 060605929): The victim was coming home, taking groceries out of her car when two suspects approached her. One of the suspects pointed a silver revolver with a white handle at her and demanded her money. The victim gave the suspects her wallet and they fled the scene. The suspects were both teenage African American males, approximately 5'6" and 160 pounds. The suspect with the gun had a gold front tooth and was wearing a gray hooded sweatshirt.

Wednesday, June 7, 2006, 11:00 PM, Sweeney and Boylston, Robbery with firearm (case # 060606068): The victim was walking home when a car drove up. The suspect got out of the car and pointed a silver hand gun at the victim and demanded money. The victim dropped her purse which was then grabbed by the suspect. The suspect then left in the car. The suspect was a teenage African American male, 5'7", 120 pounds wearing a gray sweatshirt.

Thursday, June 8, 2006, 12:00 PM, 300 block of Wheeler, Stolen Car/Warrant arrest (case # 060607360): Bayview homeless coordinator Lavin responded to the 300 block of Wheeler on a report of a person living in a vehicle. When

she arrived, the person inside the vehicle popped out and told her that he had just bought the car, which he was in the process of spray painting silver. Although there were no plates, a DMV check on the VIN showed that the car was reported stolen back in May. An arrest search revealed that the suspect had private paperwork from the owner of the car in his pocket. A warrant check revealed that the suspect was on probation for auto theft out of San Mateo County and also had outstanding warrants for his arrest. The suspect was booked on the warrant and stolen auto charges at Bayview Station.

Many of our arrests come from citizens reporting suspicious activity in their neighborhood. If you see something that doesn't appear right, call the police and we will check it out.

Thursday, June 8, 2006, 5:00 PM, Newhall and McKinnon, Narcotics and Probation Violation arrest (case # 060608694): Plainclothes Officers, Alcarez, Solares and Mustafich were on patrol in the area of Newhall and McKinnon when they noticed two men huddled beside a house on the west side of Newhall. The officers observed that one of the men was holding out cash as if he were about to buy something. The second man had his hand cupped, showing something to the first man. When the officers approached, the second man immediately threw down the contents of his cupped hand. The officers retrieved the small package that was thrown down and found crack cocaine inside. The officers took the man who threw the package down into custody and found out that he was already on felony probation. The suspect was booked at Bayview Station on narcotic sales and probation violation charges.

Saturday, June 10, 2006, 2:00 AM - Domestic Violence Incident - Possession of a rifle by a Felon - Potrero Hill Housing - CS #: 060 574 114 - Numerous Officers responded to the area of Potrero Hill Housing on a report of a domestic violence incident. Officers Robinson, Lane, Norris, and Maguire were the first on scene. When they approached the unit they heard a man yell, "Let me in." The officers rounded the corner the man saw them and began to walk away. The man was carrying a long brown bag and placed it in a garbage can as he walked away, yelling obscenities all the while. The woman came to the door and identified the man as her assailant. The officer moved in to detain the man. The man began to resist the officers. Fortunately, Officers Johnson and Erb arrived on scene and joined in the melee.

The man was brought into custody but not without injuring an officer and sustaining some injuries of his own. The victim told officers that the man was her boyfriend of eight years and they had an argument. The woman picked up a phone and began to call the police. The man knocked the phone out of her hand and left the house. He then returned a short time later and demanded entry. The police arrived soon after.

Officers investigated the bag that the man discarded before being apprehended. The bag contained a hunting rifle. The man was booked for numerous charges.

Saturday, June 10, 2006 5:36 PM, Loitering in a known Drug Area, Warrant Arrest - Kirkwood Avenue and Newhall Street - CS# 060 616 192 - A known gang member spent the remainder of the weekend in jail due to the efforts of the Bayview Plainclothes team. The officers spotted the man who is also on probation loitering in the area his gang claims for their narcotics sales. He also had a warrant. A search of his person revealed that he had marijuana in his possession but no medical card. He booked for narcotics related charges and the warrant.

Sunday, June 11, 2006, Midnight through 7:30 AM - Domestic Violence - Potrero Hill Housing - CS# 0600 617 833 - Officer Bodisco responded to a domestic violence incident. When he arrived he found the victim who suffered a minor lacerations to her lip and hand by the hand of her off an on again boyfriend. The suspect, high on crack, punched the victim in the mouth and attempted to stab the victim. She stated that the suspect fled out the back door and over the balcony railing.

The suspect was apprehended the next day when he went to the victim's parents house and began to throw rocks at the window.

Monday, June 12, 2006, 7:25 AM - Burglary - 1600 block of Evans - CS# 060 620 723 - Officer Cowhig and Kwan reported that a woman was arrested for burglary. The woman walked into a warehouse and into the office area and began to rummage through the drawers. The woman found the petty cash drawer and began to make an unauthorized withdrawal. An employee walked in on the woman and alerted other staff members. They detained the woman and waited for the police to arrive.

The woman was read her Miranda Rights and she admitted that she took the money. The woman, on probation from Alameda County for burglary was booked for numerous burglary and theft charges.
