SFPD Youth Fishing Program

The San Francisco Youth Fishing Program will begin its 38th year of taking local kids fishing. The program will run from June 20th through August 19th and fish for salmon. The program is open to established community groups that serve San Francisco Youth.

The boat will leave every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from Fisherman's Wharf at 5:30AM. The boat can accommodate fourteen kids and one supervisor. The youth participants must be over 12 years old and under 18 years old. Anyone over the age of 16 must possess a Fishing License. A one-day license can be purchased on board. Equipment and bait will be provided. The group must supply their own transportation and food.

Friday, June 23, 2006 - 2:55 AM - Auto Theft, Conspiracy, Possession of Burglary Tools - 600 Block of Mendell Street - CS# 060 664 737 - Officers Sullivan and Batchelder were dispatched to the 600 Block of Mendell Street on a report of people breaking into a vehicle. When they arrived they found the victim who is frantically pointing to two people standing on the corner. These people were detained. The frantic man told police that he was driving home when he saw these two guys in his truck. He stopped and told the two men to leave but one of the suspects grabbed his waistband in

a threatening manner. The man fearing that the person had a gun, fled and called the police.

The man returned to his truck and saw that his stereo was missing. The police found the stereo in a strand of weeds in a few feet from the truck. The men, both from San Francisco, were booked for auto theft and possession of burglary tools.

Sunday, June 25th, 2006 - 11:20 AM - Aggravated Assault with a Gun- 1200 Block of Quesada - CS# 060 672 570 - A seventeen year old boy was a victim of a gun shot wound to his leg, this morning on the 1200 block of Quesada. The young man, who survived the attack, said he was in the area getting his car fixed when he was shot. He said he did not know who did this. A few witnesses stepped forward and said that the victim was standing outside when a car pulled adjacent to him and began to open fire and then fled the area. Gang Task Force is investigating this incident.

Sunday, June 25th, 2006 - 11:24 PM - Auto theft - 26th and Wisconsin Streets - CS# 060 674 667 - Officers Batchelder and Sullivan were on patrol when they noticed a vehicle that was parked and missing its license plates. They approached the vehicle and found a male that was lying across the front seat with a pair of pliers in his hands and actively working on the steering column. He was promptly detained. The man claimed that the car belonged to him, however computer records indicated that the car belongs to someone around the corner. The owner of the car was located and claimed the car as his and said that the man did not have permission to steal it.

The man, a local resident, was booked for auto theft charges. It should be noted that the officers also located a car in the area that was owned by the thief. Inside of the car was a nine-year-old girl who stated that she was waiting for her dad. The girl's mother was located and she picked up her daughter.

Monday, June 26, 2006 - 4:25 PM - Homicide - 1000 Block of Connecticut - CS# 060 674 924 - A 46 year old fell victim to gun violence on this date. Much information is being withheld so the investigation is not compromised. It should be noted that a possible suspect was arrested later that evening and another suspect turned himself in the next day.

Monday, June 26, 2006 - 10:30 AM - Robbery - Thomas Avenue and Keith Street - CS# 060 676 889 - Workers of an area Health Clinic reported that a woman, who was since transported to the Hospital, was the victim of a robbery. Officers Whitney and Horan met with the woman who stated that she was jumped on the corner of Keith and Thomas by six people. She stated that she knew three of the people by their street monikers of "Delicious", "Scar", and "Jay". The woman stated that just prior to the attack;

"Delicious" shouted, "Why did you do that?" The victim believes that it was a reference to when she told "Jay" that "Delicious" stole some crack from him. "Delicious" began to assault the victim.

During the melee, "Scar" searched the victim trying to locate crack cocaine. The woman, who suffered a broken eye socket, is working with Inspectors to locate her attackers.

Tuesday, June 27, 2006 - 10:02 AM - Sex Offender, Failing to Register - Quint and Carroll - CS# 060 680 084 - Officers Hopkins and Dalton responded as back-up top Officer Finnegan's traffic stop. A search of the computer database showed that the driver, who in addition to having a suspended driver's license, had failed to register per Megan's Law for rape. The man was booked for the offense and had his car towed.

Tuesday, June 27, 2006 - 8:59 PM - Possession of a loaded Firearm, Participation in a Criminal Street Gang - 3rd Street at Palou Avenue - CS# 060 682 604 - A nineteen year old San Francisco man was arrested this evening by Officers Ellis and Coleman. They spotted the individual that they knew as a gang member loitering on the corner of 3rd Street and Palou Avenue. Since the man was not in his usual gang territory the Officers thought something might be up. When the officers approached the male, he quickly turned away and held onto his waistband.

They began to search the man who was now sweating profusely. During the search a loaded gun fell from the man's waistband and onto the ground. The man was booked for numerous felony charges.

Thursday, June 29, 2006, 3:00 PM, Connecticut and Cesar Chavez, Warrant/Narcotics arrest (case # 060690011): Plain clothes Officers Aherne, Alcaraz, Benzinger and Solares were driving on Connecticut near Cesar Chavez when they noticed a man wanted on a \$75,000 narcotics warrant. The officers detained him without further incident. During an arrest search, they found that he had more narcotics on him. He was booked on the warrant and narcotics charges at Bayview Station.

Friday, June 30, 2006, 1:00 AM, Griffith and Cameron, Robbery with poles and sticks (case # 060691699): The victim had to have cigarettes at 1:00 AM in the morning. On his way back from the store 8 suspects surrounded him and started to beat him with a pole and sticks. The victim lost consciousness and when he woke up found that the suspects had taken his address book, which was in his back pocket, similar to a wallet. The victim said that the suspects were all teenage African Americans, a mix of male and female.

Friday, June 30, 2006, 8:17 AM, 1400 block of Quesada, Warrant arrest (case # 060692205): Officers Chi and Ernst were on patrol when Officer Chi

noticed that the car in front of them had a cracked windshield. The officers pulled the car over and found through a DMV check that the driver's license had been suspended for failing to appear in a court case. Additionally, the officers found that because he had not appeared in a court case, there was a \$25,000 warrant out for the drivers arrest. The driver was booked at Bayview on the warrant as well as vehicle code violations.

The twist on this one is that Officer Ernst is the one that arrested him on the original case approximately 3 years ago for which then he failed to appear once he was released on his own recognizance.

Friday, June 30, 2006, 4:00 PM, San Bruno and Thorton, Forgery (case # 060694126): Officers responded to the Bank of America on San Bruno on a report of a man attempting to cash a fraudulent check. When they arrived, a teller pointed to a man who was detained without incident. The bank manager told the officers that the suspect had attempted to cash a similar fraudulent check a month ago and that they had refused at that time, but they did not contact the police. The bank manager had been able to contact the supposed owner of the check who said that it was forged. The suspect was transported to Bayview Station where he was booked on fraud AND burglary charges. Why burglary? Since he entered the building with the intent to commit the fraud (felony), then he actually had committed a burglary as well. His intent is shown by his entering a second time with a similar forged check after being told the first time that the check was not valid.

Friday, June 30, 2006, 4:35 PM, San Bruno and Thorton, Forgery, False ID and Warrant arrest (case # 060694245): Only a half hour later, officers responded to the Bank of America on San Bruno on the report of another fraud in progress. When they arrived, they met with the bank manager who directed them to a man who was attempting to cash a check. The man had a fake California driver's license that didn't have enough letters and numbers as well as a fake Social Security card. He was attempting to cash the check using these forged documents which he eventually admitted he had obtained on Mission Street. The suspect told officers that although the cards were fake, the information was still correct. The suspect was transported to Bayview Station where a fingerprint check revealed that not only was the information on the cards not correct, but that he had a warrant for his arrest. He was booked on fraud, false information to a police officer and the warrant at Bayview Station.

Saturday, July 1, 2006, 1:30 PM, 1300 block of Newhall, Vehicle hits 2 year old pedestrian (Case # 060697722): Officers responded to a report of an accident involving a 2 year old child. When they arrived, they found that a 2 year old child had been hit by a car. It is somewhat unclear why a 2 year old was wandering in the street, but she was taken to SFGH for

treatment. However, the car that hit her was ½ a block away and the driver as well as the driver's wife were on the ground, having been beaten by 8 to 10 men that had come out of a local house. The driver told officers that he stopped when he realized he had hit something, but a mob of men came and pulled him out of his car, threw him to the ground and started kicking and beating him. His wife who was following in a car behind him also got pulled out of her car, thrown to the ground and beaten. One of the suspects then got in the car and tried to steal it. However, a passenger in the car was able to shut the car off and take the keys. Officers attempted to enter the house in question where all the suspects fled when the police arrived, but the driver and his wife said that they just wanted to leave.

Saturday, July 1, 2006, 5:30 PM, Narcotics arrest from parking citation (case # 060698128): Officers Odum and Rodatos were on patrol when they noticed a van parked on the sidewalk. Knowing that this constitutes a hazard for the handicapped and others with restricted mobility, Officers Odum and Rodatos decided to issue the van a parking citation, an infraction. When they checked the DMV records for the van, they found that the van's registration was expired. However, the van was displaying current registration tabs. With all the commotion around his van, the owner stepped out and asked if there was a problem. The owner identified himself as the owner and presented papers proving that he was in fact the owner. As such, he was arrested for false registration tabs, a misdemeanor. During an arrest search, Officer Odum found a large quantity of suspected cocaine hydrochloride as well as a few rocks of crack cocaine, possession of which is a felony. So from the original infraction parking citation, the suspect was eventually booked on felony narcotics charges and his van was towed.

Sunday, July 2, 2006, 11:20 PM, Commer Court, Robbery with firearm (case # 060702688): The victim, a taxi cab driver, was dropping off a fare on Commer Court when three suspects wearing ski masks got into the taxi. The suspect in back of the driver stuck a gun to the back of the seat while the one in the passenger seat grabbed the keys and threw them away. The suspects then pulled the driver from the car and dragged her away from the car. They then stuck the gun in her face and demanded money. Unfortunately for the robbers, cab drivers now keep most money in a safe, which they cannot access; they only keep enough on them to make change. Additionally, because all taxicabs now have video, their actions were caught on tape for future prosecution.

Sunday, July 2, 2006, 11:40 PM, Girard and Silver, Attempted Carjacking (case # 060702600): The victim was sitting in his car with his girlfriend in his girlfriend's driveway on the unit block of Girard. They had all the windows up and the doors locked. Suddenly one of the suspects attempted to open the driver's door; the other suspect stood lookout behind the car.

The first suspect then ran around to other doors and tried to pull them open. The victim kept his cool, started his car and backed out of the driveway, causing both suspects to jump out of the way to keep from getting hit. The victim could see a large knife in the hand of the first suspect as he drove away.

The suspects both wore ski masks, but are still described as African American males in their late teens or early twenties. One was approximately 6' tall and 170 pounds and the other one was approximately 5'10" and 165 pounds.

Monday, July 3, 2006, 11:30 PM, Westbrook Court, Attempted Homicide with firearm (case # 060706339): Officers responded to Westbrook Court on a report of a shooting. When they arrived they found the victim with several gun shots to his torso and legs. No further information is available at this time.

Tuesday, July 4, 2006, 00:21 AM, 2200 block of Quesada, Robbery with gun (case # 060706505): The victim was returning home late at night. As she was getting out of her car, three suspects wearing ski masks approached her and pointed a silver handgun at her. They told her not to move as they searched through her car. Finding nothing to take, they then fled in a non-descript car.

Tuesday, July 4, 2006, 1:21 AM, Unit block of Industrial, Robbery with gun (case # 060706602): The victim was sitting with his wife on the unit block of Industrial when he heard a knock on the window. He looked up and saw a silver handgun. The suspect demanded that he open the window. The victim fearing for his life, opened the window and gave the suspect his money and wallet. The victim said that he thought that there were two other suspects.
