### Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Tuesday, February 7, 2006, 1:20 PM. Vehicle Burglary, Possession of Burglary Tools. 1300 Block of Revere Ave. Case #:060143719 Bayview Officer Robinson was driving down Shafter Ave. when a man flagged him down from the sidewalk. The man explained that his car had just been burglarized. He told the officer that he had seen a suspect walking quickly from the area. Officer Robinson asked the man to get into his patrol car and together the two went looking for the suspect. A block away the victim spotted the man he had seen walking from his car. Officer Robinson detained the man. When the Officer removed a camera from the suspect's sleeve, the victim immediately recognized it as his own. Next, Officer Robinson found a cell phone tucked into the suspect's waistband. As other Officers held the suspect, Officer Robinson asked the victim for his cell phone number. Sure enough, when the Officer called the number, the phone in the suspect's pants began to ring! The victim assured the Officers that he did not know the suspect and certainly didn't know the suspect's phone number! The suspect, a Bayview resident, also had several screwdrivers stashed away on his person. He was booked at Bayview Station.

Tuesday, February 7, 2006. 3:28 PM. Marijuana for Sale, Methamphetamine for Sale, Narcotics Paraphernalia. Palou Ave. at Lane St. Case #: 060114165. Bayview Plainclothes Officers Lyons, Ellis, Lew, and Scott were driving on Lane St. when Officer Lyons recognized a male pedestrian from a prior arrest and ongoing court case. The Officers made a U-turn and Officer Lyons watched the man throw a plastic baggie onto the sidewalk. The Officers stopped the man and retrieved the large ziplock baggie that he had thrown. Inside the bag was a quantity of marijuana, methamphetamine, and 54 small plastic baggies. These small baggies are the common street

packaging for street narcotics sales. The man, a Bayview resident, was booked at Bayview Station.

Wednesday, February 8, 2006. 12:06 PM. Aggravated Assault with a Gun. Unknown Location. Case #: 060147971. Bayview Officers Doherty and Lamma arrived at SFGH to investigate a shooting. Apparently a gunshot victim had arrived at the hospital minutes before. Upon arrival the Officers met with a woman who claimed to be the victim's aunt. She explained that she had picked up her nephew after he called her and told her he had been shot. She could not seem to remember where she picked him up. Next, the hospital Sheriff Deputy pointed out another man who had accompanied the victim and his aunt in her car. The Officer's approached the man who gave a fishy story that was very contradictory to what the aunt had stated. Finally the Officers met the victim who had been shot once the leg. The victim provided three different locations when asked about the area of the shooting. When the Officers attempted find the man with the fishy story to clarify some issues they discovered that he had left the hospital. Upon returning to Bayview Station, the Officers learned that a warrant had just been issued for the arrest of the missing man. Apparently he is connected with another shooting from last week. The SFPD Gang Task Force is investigating the case.

Thursday, February 9, 2006. 9:55 PM. Aggravated Assault with a Gun, Robbery. Watchman Way. Case #:060154349. Bayview Officers Rodriguez and Correa responded to Watchman Way when they learned that a man had been shot. The Officers found the man in an apartment on Watchman Way. He was standing next to the sink holding a bloody towel to his buttock area. The man described how he had been sitting outside when three unknown black males approached him. The man could only remember that one of the men wore a grey hooded sweatshirt and had dreadlocks. Next he noticed that one of the men was pointing a gun at him. One of the men demanded all of the victim's belongings. Another suspect said, "Tap, Tap, Tap". That's when one of the men shot him. The victim was able to run to a friend's house. The friend had also witnessed the attempted robbery. Both men told responding Officers that they would not recognize the robbers if they saw them again. The victim was transported to SFGH and treated.

Friday, February 10, 2006, 1:29 PM Crack Arrest - Thomas and Keith - CS # 060 156 897 - A San Francisco man that was standing in the middle of the street caught the attention of Bayview Officers Remedios and Altorfer. They contacted the man and learned that he had an outstanding warrant. As the Officers performed a search of the arrested man they found a balled up wad of paper in the man's pant pocket. Even before the Officers could unravel the paper he admitted, "Yeah, I have a rock," street parlance for crack cocaine. The man was booked for the warrant and narcotics offenses.

Block of Dakota Street - CS # 060 161 012 - Officer DeJesus received inside information that a San Francisco resident kept a large amount of cocaine inside his residence in the Potrero Hill Housing Project. The subject also happened to be on felony probation for weapons charges and as a condition of his probation he is subject to warrantless search with or without probable cause; that also includes the individual's home. This provision is accepted by the person as a condition of their probation and thus the individual is allowed to be free instead of in jail. Officers DeJesus, Mustafich, and Fitzpatrick saw the subject standing outside and elected to search him. They found a key to a house. The subject tried to tell the Officers that the key belongs to his sister's house in the East Bay. But the Officers knew better and went to the subject's house.

They put the key in the door and attempted to open the door, however an individual inside turned the dead bolt and prevented the officers from entering. The Officers identified themselves repeatedly but the person on the other side would not open the door. After a few minutes the person, who happened to be the subject's girlfriend opened the door. It turns out that this woman barricaded the door for good reason; over one pound of cocaine was found in the laundry room floor, along with ingredients to turn this cocaine into crack.

The subject and his girlfriend were booked for numerous narcotics charges. It should be noted that their children, a six year old and a 20 month old were present in the apartment and the cocaine was easily accessible to their curious hands.

Saturday, February 11, 2006 - 10:10PM - Robbery with a Gun - Palou Avenue at Ingalls Street - CS # 060 162 076 - Officers Farrell and Anderson were flagged down by a Bayview resident who said that he was robbed a few minutes ago. The man was at the corner with his pocket bike when five young black males wearing all dark clothing jumped out of the bushes and attacked him. One of the males began to choke the man while the other subjects rummaged through his pockets. One of the suspects pointed a handgun at the man. Fearing for his life the man gave no resistance. The man was relieved of his pocket bike, his money, and cell phone. One subject jumped on the pocket bike and fled towards the Oakdale/Baldwin Housing Projects. The remaining subjects ran after him.

Sunday, February 12, 2006 - 2:30PM - 700 block of Brussels Street - Robbery with a Gun - CS # 060 164 210 - A pizza delivery man was approached by two men after making a delivery. The one suspect said to the man, "You know what is up, 'G'". The other male lifted up his shirt and displayed what appeared to be the butt of a handgun. The pizza man relinquished fifty dollars in cash.

The first subject is described as a black male 20-25 years old, 6'00" 150

lbs, wearing dark clothing. The second male is described as being 5'07"  
130 lbs, wearing dark clothing.

Monday, February 13 2006 - 6:15 PM - Robbery w/ Gun, Arrest made - Tunnel Avenue/Lathrop - CS # 060 169 709 - Two women were robbed in the evening as they exited the CalTrain Station. The two women walked towards the street when they saw two men standing on the corner. The women got an uneasy feeling and crossed the street to get away from the men. The men crossed the street also. The men approached the two women, brandished a gun and said, "Give me all your money". They said that they did not have any money. One of the suspects struck the woman in the back of her head with his hand causing her to fall to the ground. The suspect ripped the purse from the woman.

The suspect with the gun struck the other woman on the side of her head with the gun and took her backpack. Both men fled on foot and then into a waiting vehicle. The one woman yelled for help and a few witnesses appeared. Officers soon arrived on scene and a suspect and vehicle description was broadcast over the radio.

A few minutes elapsed when off-duty Officer A. Castro who was listening to his police radio saw a vehicle that matched the description at a gas station on 3rd and Evans. Officer Castro radioed his findings and numerous units moved in. Sgt. Ali, Officer Jackson, and Officer Parker were the first to make contact. They saw that one of the passengers was attempting to hide what appeared to be a firearm in between the seats. All three occupants were taken into custody. Inside of the vehicle was the stolen merchandise. A "Cold Show" was performed with the witnesses and the victims. The primary assailants were positively identified.

All three Bayview/Hunter's Point men were booked for robbery and assault related charges. One of the assailants also happened to be on felony probation for carrying a concealed firearm.
