Police Officer Application Drive

Starting November 1, 2005 and throughout the month of November, the SFPD is accepting applications for employment as a San Francisco Police Officer. Applications are available at Bayview Station as well as other district stations, the Police Academy (350 Amber Dr) and the Department of Human Resources (44 Gough). In order to be accepted the applications must be postmarked by November 30, 2005 or be hand delivered to the Examination Unit at 850 Bryant, Rm 577-13 by November 30, 2005.

Minimum qualifications:

- Must be 20 years of age by November 30, 2005
- US citizen or permanent resident
- US high school diploma or equivalent
- Valid drivers license
- No domestic violence convictions
- No felony convictions

- Lock car doors, whether driving or parked.
- Keep keys in your hand when walking to your car or home.
- When shopping with children, teach them to go to a store clerk or security guard if you get separated.
- If someone demands your purse or wallet, surrender it immediately-it's not worth your life.

Prevent Car Break Ins

- Leave nothing visible in the car. Keep vehicle locked.
- Keep packages locked in your trunk when shopping. Move your car to a different location each time you do this.
- Never leave your vehicle with the engine running.

Pickpocketing and ID Theft

- Bring only the cash you will need.
- Keep cash separate from IDs and credit cards.
- Do not carry your social security card or passport.
- Record credit card numbers so you can immediately report any loss to the issuing company.
- Strong, confident body language and eye contact with others is likely to discourage pickpocketing.
- If taking public transit, keep your fast pass separate from your purse and wallet.
- Shred receipts that show your credit card number.

Home Burglary Prevention

- Put timers on different lights throughout the interior and exterior of the house.
- Have newspapers, mail and deliveries held or picked up by someone you trust.
- Take a home inventory of your valuables and record serial numbers; engrave property with your CA driver's license number. Photograph your items.

Charity and Fundraising Fraud

- Request written information about the organization.
- Don't be fooled by a name that closely resembles the name of a respected or well known charity.

Crimes and Law Enforcement

Tuesday, November 22, 2005, 12:30 PM. Homicide by Firearm (case # 051319585):

Officers responded to the 1200 block of Silver on a report of a shooting. When they arrived, they found two victims shot in a mini-van. According to witnesses at the scene, the victims were driving west on Silver when a silver colored van passed them on the left. The occupants of the passing van were three African American men. As the suspects' van passed the victims' van, the suspects shot at the victims several times hitting both of them. Witnesses stated that the suspects had automatic rifles. The suspect vehicle's sliding side door came off at the scene and was laying in the middle of the street.

One of the victims was pronounced dead at the scene. The other was transported to the SFGH emergency room where he was in critical condition.

Neither victim is a resident of the Bayview District.

The van without the side door was soon found parked in McLaren Park. A perimeter was set up around the north end of the park and it was searched by K-9, Specialists Units and even the Coast Guard Helicopter, but the suspects were not found.

Tuesday, November 22, 2005, 7:30 PM and 9:15 PM, IPOD Robberies (case # 051321881 and 051321671):

Two similar street robberies of IPOD music players ... On the unit block of Scotia at approximately 7:30 PM, a juvenile was riding his bike home when 4 African American juvenile males drove up to him in a Ford Explorer. The African American juveniles then surrounded the victim; one of them held a knife up to the victim's face while he took the victim's IPOD which was clipped to his belt. The suspects then jumped back into the Explorer and fled.

At approximately 9:15 PM, a young couple was walking at Cortland and Andover when two African American juveniles ran up behind them and snatched an IPOD from the male victim's hand. The two suspects then ran to a red car which was waiting for them and fled eastbound on Cortland.

Wednesday, November 23, 2005, 3:25 PM, Concealed Firearm and Crack Cocaine Sales (case # 051324722):

Plain clothes Officers Ahern, Mallinger, Mustafich and Solares were patrolling the area around Keith and Thomas when they noticed an African American male standing on the south west corner of the intersection. This particular location has been cited by residents as a common place for drug dealers to stand when attempting to sell narcotics. The officers noted that while it was a warm day, this individual had his sweatshirt sleeve on his right hand pulled several inches over his right hand; his left sleeve was normal indicating that he might have been hiding something in his right hand that stuck out far beyond his hand.

The officers approached the suspect, but as soon as he spotted the officers, he started to quickly walk away. The officers told the suspect that they were police and commanded him to stop, but he continued to walk away. They also commanded him to show his hands, but he would only show his left hand and tucked his right hand under his shirt. The officers caught up with the suspect and were able to grab his right hand and detain him. The man then said, "I got a gun." Officer Solares who was holding his right arm and hand, exposed the hand where holding the gun. The suspect had his finger on the trigger and the hammer was cocked back. It would have only taken a light squeeze on the trigger to have fired the gun at the officers ...

Incident to the arrest, the suspect was searched and several pieces of crack cocaine were found in the suspect's shoe. The suspect turned out to be a convicted felon who is prohibited from having a firearm. The firearm was registered to another miscreant who is currently in custody on attempted murder charges. The suspect, a Bayview resident, was booked on weapons and narcotics charges at Bayview Station.

Wednesday, November 23, 2005, 5:45 PM, Robbery with Firearm (case # 051325350):

An African American man walked into the ARCO station at Carroll and Bayshore and pointed a semi-automatic gun at the cashier. The suspect then demanded money. Fearing for his life, the cashier complied and gave him the money from the cash register. He was wearing a hooded sweatshirt and sunglasses, but fortunately he was caught on video by the security cameras.

Wednesday, November 23, 2005, 3:00 PM, Elder Embezzlement (CS # 051 324 700):

An Eighty year old woman was a victim of embezzlement over the course of the last twelve months by her care taker. The suspect would perform religious rituals including sacrificing live animals and then charge the victim a fee for the service. When money ran out the suspect made arrangement with a friend to refinance the victims' property.

The victim was able to keep her house because the suspect suffered a stroke and was hospitalized. It is estimated that the suspect stole approximately \$20,000.00 over the course of the year. Formal charges are pending.

Thursday, November 24, 2005, 7:42 AM, Cocaine Offense, Probation Violation - Jennings & Van Dyke (CS # 051 326 659):

Plainclothes Officers started Thanksgiving getting a drug dealer off the streets. Officers noticed a vehicle driving erratically on Third Street. They also recognized the driver being on felony probation and a known drug dealer. Fearing for the public's safety they attempted a traffic stop. The driver stopped, stuck his head out the window, saw that it was the police and continued to drive.

The driver drove slowly until he reached the corner of Van Dyke and Jennings where he stopped on a sidewalk. Officers slowly approached but the driver kept the engine running and appeared to be stuffing an object in his rear waistband. He did not comply with the lawful orders to step out of the car. Fearing that the driver could be stuffing a handgun in his pants he was removed from the vehicle. After he was handcuffed it was discovered that the driver was attempting to stuff crack cocaine down his

The driver, who is not a Bayview resident, later admitted to being high on crack. He was booked for numerous charges.

Thursday, November 24, 2005, 08:35 AM, Assault with a Shovel. 1700 block of Keith Street (CS # 051 326 803):

A man was arriving at a friend's house for Thanksgiving. When he stepped out of the car the host, now known as booked suspect, approached him and said "You are disrespecting me by bringing dinner guests around here." The host then struck the victim in the face with an ash shovel from the fireplace.

Friday, November 25, 2005, 3:15 AM, Robbery w/gun Pennsylvania and Mariposa (CS # 051 328 978)

Two men just getting off work in the area of Pennsylvania Street and Mariposa and were walking to their car. As he was opening his car door the suspect approached him. The suspect's accomplice stood at the other side of the door.

The first suspect took out a long barreled gun and told the first victim to give him all of his money. The suspect made the same demand to the second victim. When the suspect was not pleased with what little money that the second suspect had, he was struck in the face with the butt end of the rifle. The second suspect was also armed with a handgun.

The first suspect is described as a Black male 21-25 years old 6'02" 170lbs. wearing a black hooded jacket or sweatshirt. The second suspect is described as a Black male unknown age about 5'08" and 200 lbs. Wearing a white jacket and described as having a "Chubby Face."

An elderly woman (90 years old) was walking with her daughter when they were approached by two suspects. The suspects pushed the elderly woman to the ground and subsequently took the daughter's handbag and fled on foot.

The elderly woman was brought to the hospital and treated for a broken pelvis from the suspect's cowardly actions. The handbag was recovered a short time later. Crime Scene responded and attempted to get usable fingerprints from the bag with negative results.

Saturday, November 26, 2005. 10:08 PM, Street Robbery, Jakey Ct. (Case #: 051335149):

Bayview Officers Pashby and Martinez arrived at an address on Jakey Ct. and met with a man, his girlfriend, and their child. The family had just been robbed at gunpoint. The man described how a 25 year old black man, 5'06" 150 lbs., and wearing dark clothing approached his girlfriend and pointed a silver semi-automatic handgun at her head. "Give me your purse, I'm going to shoot you!" the thug threatened. The girlfriend refused to give up her purse. This prompted the suspect to point the gun at the man and warn, "Give me your money or I'll shot the kid!" The suspect fled on foot after the male victim gave him \$300.00 in cash from his wallet. There have been similar robberies in this area with similar suspect descriptions.

Sunday, November 27, 2005. 12:52 AM, Domestic Violence Warrant Arrest, 1100 block of Palou. (Case #:051331040).

Bayview Officers were on the prowl for an at-large domestic violence suspect. In a prior incident the man forced his girlfriend to the ground in their apartment. He then proceeded to douse her with rubbing alcohol and set her on fire. Apparently he thought the woman was cheating on him. Armed with intelligence from various sources Officers Byrne, Wise, Damonte, Pashby, Martinez, Luedtke, and Johnson found the suspect hiding out in a garage on the 1100 block of Palou. The man was booked at Bayview Station on Felony Attempted Murder, Domestic Violence Battery, Mayhem, and Aggravated Assault charges.

Monday, November 28, 2005. 3:20 PM, Indecent Exposure, Juvenile Victim. 600 block of San Bruno. (Case #: 051341500).

Bayview Sgt. Shea met with a woman near 600 San Bruno Ave. The woman explained that she had just witnessed a man expose his genitals to two separate groups of teenage girls. The man was hiding in the bushes near the 18th St. pedestrian bridge that crosses US 101. As the girls would cross the bridge the man would pop out from the bushes and lower his pants in front of them. In both cases the girls ran away from the flasher. The woman explained how the man finally removed his shirt and ran west across the bridge and disappeared from sight in the area of 18th St and Utah St. The suspect is described as a black male, 30 years old, 5'09" 150lbs.,
