Captain's Message:

Parking and Traffic Enforcement

In the past, the practice of parking vehicles on the sidewalks of the district has been tolerated. Vehicles parked in this manner block passage for pedestrians, baby strollers and wheel chairs, and contribute to the overall blight in the neighborhood. This practice is illegal and is not tolerated in other areas of the city.

After receiving several complaints about these vehicles, we have initiated an operation with the assistance of the Department of Parking and Traffic (DPT) to address this problem. Last week, DPT began posting warning notices on illegally parked vehicles in and about the Third Street Corridor.

Beginning next week, citations will be issued to illegally parked vehicles. These are \$100 citations. If you park your vehicle responsibly, respecting the rights of your neighbors and the visitors to our community, you should not have any problems.

Robbery Arrests:

In response to the recent surge of robberies on Potrero Hill, officers from Bayview Station, the Robbery Detail, and the Tactical Unit joined forces to conduct plain clothes saturation patrols area over the past several weeks. Their efforts paid off and several arrests have been made. I want to commend all of the officers involved in this operation and extend to the Robbery Detail and Tactical Unit, our appreciation for their assistance.

SIGNIFICANT INCIDENTS:

May 28, 2008-Assault, Att. Homicide w/ Gun-Kiska Rd-CN#080557350:

Officer Kavanagh, Fong and Borghesani responded to a shooting on Kiska Rd. Officers spoke with the victim who told them that he had been shot in the buttocks, while driving in his car on Kiska Rd. Officers observed numerous bullet casings and holes in his vehicle. An officer accompanied the victim to SFGH where he was treated and later released. Officers checked all the units where the bullet casings were found, no other victims were located. Officers searched for the suspects, to no avail.

Officers took control of the gun and placed the suspect under arrest without incident. No one was injured during the shooting.

Muggings & Robberies -

There have been recent muggings in several neighborhoods at night, as people are returning home.

**Consider installing a motion sensitive light; minimize things like bushes that can obstruct visibility toward the entryway of your home or building*

**Keep minimal cash, credit cards and personal items on you*
