Arrests of note:

Robbery, Violation of Probation, Tuesday Feb 5, 2008, cn#080123309, 1309 Palou:

Officers Thompson and Cabuntala responded to 1309 Palou regarding a robbery. Upon the officer's arrival, they came into contact and identified two individuals who were involved in the robbery. The officers on scene knew both individuals from prior contacts and prior arrests for narcotics and robbery. Both suspects were taken into custody and charged with violation of probation, robbery and aggravated assault. The victims in this case were also able to positively identify the suspects that had attacked and robbed them.

Aggravated Assault with a Gun, Robbery, Monday Feb 4, 2008, cn#080123309, Palou & Jennings: (related case is the case outlined above)

Officers Duffin and Borgen were patrolling through the area of Jennings and Quesada when they heard a gunshot. Immediately after the gunshot, Ofc's Duffin and Borgen were flagged down by an unknown woman who told the officers she had just been shot at and pointed at a nearby vehicle. Two suspects were detained inside the vehicle. As officers investigated further, they, along with the victims of the shooting and prior robbery, were able to positively identify the persons in the vehicle as the suspects who shot at and robbed them. Officers arrested the two suspects without incident.

Driving Drunk, Warrant Arrest, Sunday, Feb 3, 2008, cn#080119461, McKinnon & Newhall:

Officer Gonzalez, Erb and Moore were in the area of McKinnon and Newhall when they saw a blue Mercedes with no license plates. Officers stopped the vehicle, spoke with the driver and immediately noticed a strong odor of alcohol coming from the driver. Officers administered the sobriety test to the driver who failed each test. The driver was placed under arrest for driving drunk and for an outstanding warrant.

Cocaine offense, Loitering where Narcotics are used, Sunday Feb 3, 2008, cn#080119308, 1715 Quesada:

Officers Coleman, Rightmire, Ellis & Scott, of the plainclothes unit, were patrolling the 1700 block of Quesada due to the high narcotics usage and sales. Ofc. Coleman saw a vehicle, with an individual inside who he recognized from prior arrest for drug related offenses. Ofc. Coleman also knew that this individual had been admonished regarding loitering in the narcotic area on a prior arrest. Again, this suspect had a crack pipe with crack cocaine in her possession and attempted to conceal this from Ofc. Coleman. The suspect was subsequently taken into custody and again admonished not to loiter in this area with narcotics.

Gun, Loaded, Warrant Arrest, Friday Feb 1, 2008, cn#080115259, 3906 Third st:

Officer Lyons, Scott and Rightmire were in the area of Newhall and Evans. An anonymous citizen advised the officers that he observed four unknown suspects smash the window of a car parked nearby. Ofc. Lyons walked to the area and saw the four suspects on foot, walking away from the vehicle. Other officers responded to assist Ofc. Lyons. All four suspects were detained. Officer's located a handgun on one of the suspects. The suspect with the gun was placed under arrest as well as another suspect who had an outstanding warrant.

Burglary, Vehicle, Stolen Property, Thursday, Jan 31, 2008, cn#080109989, 1604 LeConte:

Officers Pascua, Scott and Buhagiar were in the area of 6600 3rd st, patrolling the parking lot of the Franciscan Hotel. A citizen flagged down officers and told them his car had just been broken into. Another witness advised Ofc. Scott that he saw a suspect break into the citizen's vehicle and that the suspect was currently standing on the Muni platform at 3rd and Le Conte. Officers responded to the area and detained two suspects. The citizen's property was found on the suspects by officers who placed both under arrest. The witness was able to positively identify the suspects and the citizen's positively identified their property.

Robbery, Street or Public Place w/ a Weapon, Wednesday, Jan 30, 2008, cn#080105761, 1524 Silver Ave:

Officers Lew, Benzinger, Correa and Coleman, of the plainclothes unit, responded to a robbery in progress at 1524 Silver Ave. The victim advised officers that the two suspects were running on Silver. Officers responded to the area and located both suspects. One was detained and placed under arrest without incident. The other suspect ran from officers and headed up Felton.

Both suspects were booked at YGC.

Homicide, Feb 4, 2008, cn#080120844, 1634 Kirkwood:

Officers from Bayview station responded to 1634 regarding a shooting. Upon the arrival, officers found the victim on the ground. A suspect was later detained and SFPD Homicide responded to the scene and took charge of the investigation.
