### Crime Alert

#### **Friday, September 21, 2007 - 2:48 PM**

Officers from Bayview Station responded to the area of Jerrold Avenue and Third Street on a report of a shooting and an accident. When officers arrived on scene they saw a car that had crashed into a parked car and its' front seat passenger slumped over with bullet wounds to his torso. He was later pronounced dead. The driver of the car was located and seeking refuge in a local business. She had a head wound, that was treated at SFGH. (CS# 070 970 411)

If you have information on this crime you may also call the anonymous tip line at (415) 575-4444. The tip line is staffed 24 hours a day and calls are not recorded. The anonymity of the caller will be respected in all cases.

Assistance from the community is essential. Those persons who come forward with information, and have concerns regarding their safety, may be eligible for Witness Protection Program services.

The conference will feature top juvenile justice leaders from the Bay Area and across the nation. It will focus on the key juvenile justice policy issues the nation is facing forty years after the seminal Supreme Court case of *In re Gault* established due process rights for children in the juvenile justice system.

Plenary panels will include a state legislator's panel, a judge's panel and a media panel. Breakout panel topics will include reforming juvenile corrections in California; juvenile justice, child welfare and mental health systems overlap; disproportionate minority confinement; alternatives to incarceration; legal representation of juveniles; restorative justice; reforming juvenile detention; trying juveniles as adults; and girls in the juvenile justice system.

The conference is attended for service providers, law enforcement officials, corrections officials, policy makers, attorneys, advocates, community leaders, funders, academics, students and others interested in juvenile justice reform.

### Crimes and Law Enforcement

*THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:*

Monday, September 17, 2007 – 7:40 AM – Stolen/Recovered Auto, Possession of Burglary Tools – CS# 070 952 691 – Officers Funk and Altofer were on patrol in the area of Candlestick Park when they saw an occupied car parked on the street. They noticed that the car had damaged door and it raised the officer's suspicions that there was something amiss. They made contact with the occupant and saw a makeshift key in the ignition. They detained the occupant pending further investigation. The car was registered in San Leandro, and a request was made for the local police to check with the registered owner regarding the whereabouts of his car. It was learned that the car was an unreported stolen vehicle. The occupant, a resident of Richmond, CA was booked for possession of burglary tools and a stolen auto.

**Tuesday, September 18, 2007 – 1:22 AM – Vehicle Burglary – Evans Avenue and Third Street – CS# 070 956 574** – Officers Cabuntala and Thompson were dispatched to the area of 3rd Street and Evans Avenue regarding an auto break-in. The 911 caller was able to give the dispatchers the suspect description. Officers Cabuntala and Thompson saw the suspect a few blocks away and detained him. The 911 caller was brought to the area where he positively identified the suspect as the person who broke into the car. The registered owner was located and was brought to the scene. She identified numerous pieces of property that were found on the suspect, as hers and that were in her car. The man was booked for auto burglary.

**Tuesday, September 18, 2007 – 4:05 AM – Aggravated assault with a knife – Jamestown and Redondo Street – CS# 070 956 819** – Bayview Officers responded to a call of a possible domestic violence. When officers arrived on scene they saw a man, wearing only pants, running down the street with his arms flailing. They stopped the man and saw that he had two stab wounds in his left shoulder blade. An ambulance was summoned and the man was treated. The man refused to cooperate any further with the police. The 911 caller was unable to provide the police with any further information.

and Palou Avenue regarding shots fired. Numerous .45 caliber bullet casings were located in the area. Numerous people approached the police but were unable to provide any information regarding a suspect. One vehicle that was parked in the area had some bullet holes. Later, another motorist responded to the station to report that his car window was shot out. Local hospitals were checked for gun shot victims with negative results.

**Wednesday, September 19th, 2007 – 12:20 AM - Aggravated Assault with a gun – 3rd Street and Hudson Avenue – CS# 070 960 597** – Bayview Officers responded to the 1600 block of Innes Street on a report of shots fired. Upon their arrival they met a man who said that he was standing on the corner of 3rd Street and Hudson Avenue when he was approached by a dark minivan with three black adult males. One of the occupants said something to the man, challenging him. The victim, verbally defended himself, and an argument ensued. The person in the van took out a machine gun type pistol from his waistband. The victim punched the gunman in the face and ran away. The gunman fired approximately three shots at him. The victim hopped several fences until he ended up on Innes Avenue.

The victim said that he did not know his assailants and refused to cooperate any further. He was uninjured in the incident.

**Thursday, September 20, 2007 – 11:25 AM – Forgery – San Bruno Avenue - CS# 070 965 694** – A Hayward woman is in custody after attempting to cash a forged check at a San Bruno Avenue bank. The teller compared the check that the man had presented to copies of previous checks that the account holder had written. They did not match and the police were notified. She was brought into custody without incident.

**Thursday, September 20, 2007 – 11:00 PM – CS# 070 968 529, Friday, September 21, 2007 – 12:05 AM – CS# 070 968 541 - Robbery Series –**

There were two robberies this last evening and in both incidents the suspect description is similar. The first incident occurred on the 1000 block of Kansas Street. A woman was walking home when a male appeared from the garage alcove, and grabbed her purse. The woman held on but was pushed to the ground by her attacker and her purse taken from her.

The second incident occurred just after midnight on the 1200 block of Rhode Island Street. In this incident, a woman just unlocked her front door and began to walk inside. A male was suddenly behind her and tugging on her purse strap. The woman attempted to hold onto her purse but the suspect elbowed her in the mouth and she let go.

The suspect in both of these cases was described as a black male 20-25 years old wearing a red, white and blue polo shirt and dark jeans. In the first incident, the suspect fled in an old, weather beaten, maroon, sedan, possibly a Toyota or a Honda.

**Friday, September 21, 2007 – 10:05 PM – Aggravated Assault with a gun – 100 block of Kiska Rd – CS# 070 971 641** – An area resident was shot in the lower back after he opened the door to his house. The police were able to interview some of the other residents to the house who told them that the victim answered the door to the house and moments later there was a gunshot. The victim refused to cooperate with the police.

**Saturday, September 22, 2007 – 11:43 AM – Possession of Narcotics, Warrant Arrest – CS# 070 973 512** – Lt. Sanford and Officer Olson were on patrol in the area of Jamestown and Gilroy when they spotted a car that was in a no parking zone. They investigated and saw that its two occupants were sleeping. A well being check was performed and the passenger was identified as having warrants. She was brought into custody. Inside her purse were numerous bundles of methamphetamine and marijuana. She was booked for the warrants and numerous narcotics charges.
