Monday, April 23, 2007 at 5:12 PM - Burglary, Residence, Forcible Entry. 1000 Block of Jamestown Avenue. CS# 070-416-380 - Dispatch sent Officer Norris and Officer Whitfield to the 1000 Block of Jamestown Avenue regarding a burglary. The Officers met with the resident who told them that when she opened the front door to her house, she saw an unknown male standing in her hallway. The male looked at her and then ran down the stairs and out the back door. The resident then called her roommate who called the police. Several units responded to the scene and set up a perimeter. The entire house was searched as well as the backyard and adjacent backyards. Officer Norris found a broken window in the basement which he believed was the point of entry. Crime Scene Investigation (CSI) was notified and Officer Evans responded out to the residence to process the scene.

Tuesday, April 24, 2007 at 1:29 AM - Assault, Aggravated, W/Gun. 1700 Block of Newcomb Street. CS# 070-417-736 - Officer Rupert and Officer Lane were sent to the 1700 Block of Newcomb Street regarding a shooting. When they arrived they saw an adult male victim lying on the ground in a fetal position. The victim had blood on his clothes and seemed to be in tremendous pain. Officer Rupert called for an ambulance which arrived on scene. The victim was unable to provide any information in regard to what happened. The victim stated that he did not see or hear anything. Officer Rupert asked several bystanders, that were in the immediate area, if they saw anything and they all said, "No." The victim was transported to San Francisco General Hospital where he was treated for four gunshot wounds. General Work Inspectors along with Crime Scene Investigation responded and took over the investigation.

Thursday, April 26, 2007 at 4:41 PM - Robbery, Street or Public Place, W/Force. Holyoke Street at Karen Court. CS# 070-427-707 - Officer Foss responded to Holyoke Street at Karen Court regarding a robbery. Officer Foss located the victim who appeared to have a bloody nose. The victim stated that he was walking on the sidewalk when he was approached by two males who began to hit him all over his body. The victim said that one of the suspects stole his wallet from his jeans pocket and then both suspects fled on foot towards San Bruno Avenue. While Officer Foss was speaking with the victim, a witness pulled up who stated that as she was parking her vehicle, she saw two males hitting the victim. The witness said that she started honking her horn and the two males took off running. Other units responded to the scene and searched the area with negative results.

in full police uniform and in marked police vehicles, Sergeant Weathersby, Officer Dalton and Officer Shavers responded to LaSalle Avenue at 3rd Street regarding three suspicious males that were smoking drugs. When they started to approach the males, one male began to distance himself from the group. The male then turned his back to the Officers and began to walk eastbound on LaSalle towards 3rd Street. Officer Dalton verbally ordered the male to stop. The male kept walking and walked into a store located on 3rd Street at LaSalle Avenue. Officer Shavers ran towards the male, while Officer Dalton and Sergeant Weathersby spoke with the other two males. As Officer Shavers reached the store, he heard the store clerk yelling at the male. Officer Shavers walked into the store just after the male had exited. The store clerk told Officer Shavers that the male had dropped "something" behind the counter. Officer Shavers looked behind the counter and found a loaded, black semi-automatic handgun lying on the floor. Officer Shavers exited the store and went after the male who now was running west on LaSalle from 3rd Street. Both Officer Dalton and Officer Shavers repeatedly ordered the male to stop running. Numerous units responded to the area and were able to take the male into custody. Officer Shavers went and spoke with the clerk at the store who told him that he had video surveillance of the male running into the store and dropping the gun. Officer Shavers seized the gun and the video tape. Crime Scene Investigation was notified and an Inspector responded to Bayview Station to seize the gun and dust it for prints. A booking counter search of the male revealed a large amount of US Currency and twenty-four individual wrapped rocks of suspected crack cocaine.

Saturday, April 28, 2007 at 1:57 AM - Assault, Aggravated with Gun. Toland Avenue at Jerrold Street. CS# 070-433-588. Officer Dizon and Officer Hernandez, along with numerous other units, responded to Toland Avenue at Jerrold Street regarding a shooting. Upon arrival the Officers saw a male adult lying in the street with a gunshot wound to his head. Officer Haynes requested an ambulance and began to render aid to the victim. An ambulance arrived and transported the male to San Francisco General Hospital. Officer Dizon saw three casings on the ground near the victim. Several units attempted to search for witnesses, but nobody in the large crowd that had gathered, seemed to have seen anything. Officers Luedtke and Bouey-Constantine were flagged down by two anonymous individuals who stated that there were additional bullet casings on the sidewalk area of Jerrold Street at Upton Street. The Officers responded to that location and saw seventeen casing on the ground. Inspectors from both General Work Detail and Crime Scene Investigation arrived on scene and took of the investigation. The man died later SFGH.

Officer Anderson and Officer Farrell responded to Toland Avenue at Jerrold Street regarding the above mentioned shooting. Upon arrival, they saw numerous people standing over the victim. Several Officers were attempting to clear the area so that they could render medical aid. As Officer Anderson was telling people to move back to the sidewalk, he observed a bullet casing on the ground next to the victim. In an attempt to secure the crime scene, he again ordered the bystanders to step back. One male adult refused to comply and stood directly over the victim shouting obscenities at the Officers. Officer Anderson advised the male that the ambulance was on its way and that he needed to step back. The male refused to move. Again Officer Anderson told the male to step back to the sidewalk or he could be arrested. The male walked directly up to Officer Anderson and continued to shout obscenities at him. Seeing this, the crowd became more agitated. Office Anderson told the male that he was under arrest for obstructing/delaying a Peace Officer's duties. With the help of Officer Farrell, Officer Anderson attempted to handcuff the male. The male began to violently twist away from the Officers and continued to yell at them. Officer Farrell attempted a department approved rear leg sweep, which failed, and all three lost their balance and fell to the ground. With the assistance of several units they were able to place the male in handcuffs. The male was eventually cited and released from the scene.

Sunday, April 29, 2007 - 10:45AM - Attempted Homicide - 100 Block of Dakota - CS# 070 437 518 - Bayview Officers responded to gruesome scene on the 100 block of Dakota Street. Inside a housing unit that was covered in blood was a man that was severely beaten with a hammer. Also present was the man's five year old son who witnessed the savage attack. The man was rushed to the hospital where he was treated for approximately thirty hammer blows to his skull and body.

The son described his father's assailant as someone that is his acquaintance. The son also described two women being present during the attack. A person has been identified as a possible suspect and is wanted for questioning.
