The Department of Child Support Services

The Department of Child Support Services (DCSS), previously a part of The District Attorney's Office, was created through Assembly Bill 196 and Senate Bill 542, in 1999. We are located in downtown San Francisco at 617 Mission Street and New Montgomery Street.

DCSS directly serves over 35,000 children of San Francisco's children residing in the City benefit from our services. We establish and enforce paternity, child support and medical insurance orders. We collect and distribute monies to families.

We pursue interstate reciprocal establishment and enforcement of child support orders in all 50 states, territories and many countries.

November 2003, our Department opened a branch office in the Bayview Hunters Point District, and in February 2002, a satellite office in the Mission-Excelsior Districts. Neighborhood residents can now open a new case or get information on how their case is progressing. We extend free full services at our main and branch offices, but we do not accept payments at the branch offices. Each of our offices has bi-lingual staff. We also have child support officers co-located at the Human Services Agency, 170 Otis Street

Monday, June 11th 2007 - 1:30 AM - Robbery of a Bar - 1300 block of 18th
Street - CS# 070 588 133 - A local bar and a few of its remaining patrons
were robbed by a masked gunman near closing time. It was reported that the
gunman came into the bar and brandished a silver gun, handed the bartender
a bag, and demanded all the money. The gunman took additional money from
two patrons of the bar before fleeing.

Monday, June 11th, 2007 - 11:48 AM - Auto Burglary - 1400 Block of Wallace
- CS# 07 589 239 - A Fillmore District resident was booked after a brazen
midday attempt to burglarize a work truck. The owner of the truck and his
friends were alerted to the sound of his car's alarm and saw the suspect
inside of it. They took custody of the man and alerted the police. The
man, on probation was booked for auto burglary.

Monday, June 11th, 2007 - 2:21 PM - Possession of Stolen Property - 1200
block of Indiana Street - CS# 070 590 172 - The San Francisco Police
Department received a telephone call from the Jessamine County Sheriff's
Department in Kentucky. They reported that a resident of their
jurisdiction was a victim of credit card fraud and learned that a computer
was purchased and shipped to an address in San Francisco. The computer was
being held at a delivery depot in the district. In cooperation with the
delivery service, Officers Ellis and Coleman pretended to be delivery men
and delivered the computer to the suspect. When the suspect came
downstairs he was taken into custody. The suspect gave permission for the
police to search his residence. Inside were numerous electronic devices.
There was documentation that indicated that at least three more people in
three states back east were victimized in the same manner. The man was
booked for one count of possession of stolen property, pending further

Friday, June 15th 2007 - 9:55 PM - Street Robbery - 18th and Carolina Streets - CS# 070 607 078 - A woman was walking down the street when she saw three males walking towards her. She saw that the males were pulling masks up around their faces as they were getting closer. The woman, now fearful for her safety attempted to get to her car that parked nearby. She got into her car and fumbled her keys. One of the suspects demanded that she hand over everything that she had. The woman threw her handbag at the feet of the suspect. The suspects then fled on foot. The suspects were described as black males one of them had a black jacket with a red vertical stripe on the front. He was between 18-23 years old, 5'09" and 150 pounds. No further description is available for the remaining suspects.

Saturday, June 16th 2007 - 7:21 PM - Possession of Crack Cocaine, Probation Violation - 900 Blk of Connecticut - CS# 070 609 698 - A Potrero Hill resident was caught red handed by Officer Solares with a large amount of crack cocaine in his hand. Officer Solares was walking through the Potrero Hill Housing complex and walked passed the man. Officer Solares looked over his shoulder and saw that the man was holding a large piece of crack cocaine in his hand. Officer Solares quickly took the man into custody. The man, on probation was booked for possession of crack cocaine for sales.

Saturday, June 16th 2007 - 8:17 PM - Discharging a Firearm - Oakdale Avenue and Baldwin Court - CS# 070 609 983 - Bayview Officers responded to the area of Oakdale Avenue and Baldwin Court on report of a green Nissan that had fired a gun from it. A green Nissan was spotted by the Officers Teper and McGuire and a traffic stop was made. While giving orders to the occupants of the car, a rear passenger got out and started to run. Other units were arriving on scene and gave chase. Officer Fowlie was the first to reach the fleeing suspect who was hiding underneath a truck. His path was retraced and a .32 caliber handgun was found. A .32 caliber casing was located at the scene of the shooting. A search of the vehicle yielded a sawed off shot gun. The occupants of the car, two adults and three juveniles were charged with various weapons charges and booked accordingly.

Saturday, June 16th 2007 - 2:17 AM - Indecent Exposure - 2200 Block of 24th Street - CS# 070 607 727 - An arrest was made of a Potrero Hill Resident that was peering into his neighbor's window while masturbating. When the police arrived the male was in the common area talking on the cell phone. He was arrested. The victim told police that the same male did the same thing three weeks prior but she did not report it.

Streets - CS# 070 610 758 - Three people were robbed at gunpoint after leaving a Potrero Hill nightclub early in the morning. The group was walking to their car when they were approached by two masked males. One of the males brandished a gun and told them to get on the ground. One of the victim's attempted to run but her path was cutoff by the second robber who pointed a sawed off shotgun at her. The suspects took money and jewelry from the group and fled. No further suspect description was available.

Sunday, June 17th, 2007 - 5:30 AM - Auto Burglary - 600 Block of Kansas - CS# 070 611 126 - A Potrero Hill resident was awakened by the sound of breaking glass from the common parking area of his apartment complex. He investigated and saw a suspicious character going in and out of the garage carrying various items. He called 911 and gave a description of the suspect to the call taker. Officer Chu was the first to arrive on scene and detained the suspect. A car was located with a smashed window and its car stereo missing from the dashboard; other items were also missing. It was determined that the woman that Officer Chu had detained was responsible for the crime. The woman, who was eight months pregnant, was booked for auto burglary.

Sunday, June 17th 2007 - 3:10 PM - Aggravated Assault - 1400 block of Lane Street - CS# 070 612 293 - A man was at his girlfriend's house was struck in his head after he answered the front door. The suspect in this case is the girlfriend's ex-boyfriend. There was no other indication of why the attack took place.

Sunday, June 17th, 2007 - 10:00 AM - Robbery Series - Northern and Park District - CS# 070 607 589 - On Saturday evening there was an armed robbery series that occurred in the Northern and Park Districts. In one of the incidents the victim was able to give the police a license plate number of the get away vehicle. The registration showed that he car was registered to a person that lives in the Bayview District. The car was located and a stakeout was established. After a few hours, a person got into the car and began to drive away. She was pulled over a few blocks away. Inside the car was property that was taken from one of the victims. The driver of the car was brought back to the station and questioned. The driver said that she leant her car to a relative last evening. She gave the police the name of that person.

That person was a juvenile on probation for robbery. Police went to his house to conduct a probation search of the residence. When police arrived, the juvenile was seen throwing crack cocaine outside of his window. He was taken into custody.

The driver of the car was booked for possession of stolen property. The
