The Department of Child Support Services

The Department of Child Support Services (DCSS), previously a part of The District Attorney's Office, was created through Assembly Bill 196 and Senate Bill 542, in 1999. We are located in downtown San Francisco at 617 Mission Street and New Montgomery Street.

DCSS directly serves over 35,000 children of San Francisco's children residing in the City benefit from our services. We establish and enforce paternity, child support and medical insurance orders. We collect and distribute monies to families.

We pursue interstate reciprocal establishment and enforcement of child support orders in all 50 states, territories and many countries.

November 2003, our Department opened a branch office in the Bayview Hunters Point District, and in February 2002, a satellite office in the Mission-Excelsior Districts. Neighborhood residents can now open a new

Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

Monday, June 4th, 2007 - 5:50 AM - Robbery - 1600 Block of Revere Avenue - CS# 070 563 389 - Police responded to a call of a man lying in a pool of blood on the 1600 block of Revere Avenue. When the police arrived he was barely conscious and was able to tell police that he was approached by four black teens; one of them with a crowbar. He was struck in the head with the crowbar, fell to the ground, and was kicked several more times. His property was stripped from him and he was left on the ground. The man was taken to SFGH for treatment. There is no further suspect description.

Monday, June 4th, 6:50 PM - Recovered, Car jacked vehicle - Jerrold and Quint - CS# 070 457 522 - Plainclothes Officers Lyons and Scott were driving enroute to a special assignment, when a car traveling at a high rate of speed drove past them. The license plate was noted and a "be on the look out" was broadcast for Bayview Units. A quick computer check revealed that the car was wanted in connection with a car jacking by a gun.

The car was seen entering the on ramp from 280 southbound by another unit and a city wide broadcast was issued. The vehicle was located a short time later on San Jose and Plymouth Avenues, just off 280.

The driver of the abandoned vehicle was spotted a few blocks away getting into the passenger side of another car. That vehicle was stopped and both people were taken into custody. The driver of what was believed to be the get away vehicle was later questioned. He said that he was driving and the suspect flagged him down. Believing that he was helping the suspect he pulled over. When he did, the suspect got into the passenger seat. When the police approached the suspect also dumped a bag of crack cocaine in his car. The young man was booked for car jacking, narcotics, and traffic offenses.

Tuesday, June 5th, 2007 - 10:21 - Auto Burglary, Parole violation - 19th and Illinois Street - CS# 070 567 955 - A parolee from Hunter's Point was arrested after an auto burglary spree in Dogpatch Neighborhood. The police received a 911 call that described a man breaking into a car. The car and the suspect were quickly found. In the vicinity was a car belonging to the suspect; inside were his female companion, their infant son, and four car stereos. The man admitted to stealing the stereos and said that his companion had nothing to do with the crimes. He admitted that he stole one of the stereos from around the corner a few minutes prior to the 911 call. The others were taken a few days before that. The man was arrested for numerous counts of auto burglary and a parole violation. He was on parole for auto burglary.

Tuesday, June 5th, 2007 - 2:34 PM - Robbery, Arrest Made - 3rd and Revere Street - CS# 070 569 268 - Two young Bayview men were booked for robbery at Bayview Station for robbing an elderly woman. It was reported that a woman in the area of Third Street and Revere Avenue when she was knocked down from behind and her backpack was ripped from her. A witness was looking at her window and saw the two men running holding the backpack from the scene. All the while they were laughing. Numerous units responded to the scene and five people were detained a few blocks away. The witness identified two people that she saw running with the purse. The robbers, one adult and one juvenile were booked for robbery. They were also arrested in April this year for the same type of crime in the downtown corridor.

Tuesday, June 5th, 2007 - 15:18 PM - Attempted Robbery - 1600 block of Palou - CS# 070 569 440 - Bike officers Festa and Martin, saw a man walking down the street with his head bleeding. They went to investigate and learned that the man was robbed by three black teens, wearing all black clothing. The man was reluctant to tell his story but it was learned that he was walking down the street when the three teens surrounded him. He was struck in the head with a bottle and they demanded that the victim turn over his money. The victim did not say if anything was taken from him and refused to cooperate any further.

Saturday, June 9th, 2007 - 10:15 PM - Homicide with a Gun - Westpoint/Middle Point Roads - CS# 070 585 054 - An Oakland man was shot numerous times in the Westpoint Housing Projects. The victim, believed to be a member of the West Mob gang, succumbed to his injuries approximately four hours later. The case is being investigated by Homicide and Gang Task Force.

Sunday, June 11th 2007 - 12:37 AM - Aggravated Assault - 700 Block of Cesar Chavez - CS# 070 585 399 - Partygoers at a night club at Cesar Chavez and Michigan Streets were interrupted by gun fire in the parking lot. Even as police arrived numerous individuals were exchanging gunfire. That person fled; however a gun was later recovered nearby. As people were fleeing it was learned that only one person had been struck in the foot by a gun shot. The street was closed down and a systematic search of cars for victims and weapons was conducted. In total, five guns were seized and seven people were booked for weapons charges. All suspects that were booked live outside San Francisco. Fortunately, no additional victims were found at area hospitals.
