#### Third Street Light Rail:

The LRVs began weekend service on Saturday, January 13th, 2007. While this will be a great asset for residents who use public transportation, those of you who drive or walk in the Third street corridor need to be careful. These vehicles are essentially trains, they are very heavy and they glide to a stop. This means that if you drive or walk into the path of an LRV, the driver can't stop very quickly. Please be careful and avoid being injured in an accident. Also, as I mentioned in previous emails, the police department will be enforcing the posted signs related to the operation of the LRV system. Friday, February 2, 2007 at 9:43 AM - Burglary, Residence, Forcible Entry; Malicious Mischief, Vandalism to Property. 1700 Block of Quesada Avenue. CS# 070 119 045 - Officers Lamma and Yoo respond to a residence regarding a burglary. The victim had renovated the home to sell at a later date and had not seen his house for about 6 months. When the victim shows up at his house to work on some finishing touches, he sees that the walls all had scrapes and dents and the new carpet was stained and filthy. There were several items left in the house by the unwanted guests, among them, a mattress with a fork and plate were left in the living room and two glass cups were left on the marble counter tops in the kitchen. Officer Lamma called C.S.I. who responded out to the scene to dust for possible prints.

Sunday, February 4, 2007 at 8:35 PM - Loitering Where Narcotics are Sold/Used; Trespassing. 1500 Block of Quesada. CS# 070 128 096 - Sergeant Hagan and Officer Coleman were on patrol in plain clothes driving in an unmarked vehicle. As they drove down the 1500 Block of Quesada, they noticed two individuals sitting on the stairs in front of a clearly posted No Trespassing sign. It should be noted that the 1500 Block of Quesada is known for its high narcotics usage and sales. It should also be noted that Officer Coleman had seen one of the individuals earlier in the day sitting

in the same spot. Sergeant Hagan and Officer Coleman parked their vehicle and approached the two individuals. As Officer Coleman approached the first individual he noticed that he quickly placed his right hand into his sweater pocket. The individual became very agitated and would not follow any of Officer Coleman's directions. For officer safety reasons, the individual was placed into handcuffs so Officer Coleman could conduct a cursory search for weapons. Turns out, this time the individual did not have any weapons on him. However, he was arrested for loitering where narcotics are sold/used, trespassing and resisting/delaying arrest.

Monday, February 5, 2007 at 4:33 PM - Heroin Offense; Suspicious Person. 1600 Block of McKinnon Avenue. CS# 070 362 759 - While on bicycle patrol on the 1600 Block of McKinnon Avenue, Officer Martin saw a female standing next to a garage door of one of the residences. Since Officer Martin is the Beat Officer which covers that area, he has come to know the majority of the people that live on that street. Realizing that the female did not live at the residence in front of which she was standing, Officer Martin asked her for her identification. The female responded that she wasn't sure if she had any, and she began to look through her purse. Officer Martin asked her if he could take a peek inside her purse to make sure that she did not have any weapons. The female opened up her purse and handed it to Officer Martin allowing him to search her purse. As Officer Martin looked inside her purse, he saw a clear plastic syringe containing a brown liquid substance. Due to Officer Martin's extensive narcotics training, he believed that the substance inside the syringe was liquid heroin. He then arrested the female without incident. It should be known that a computer check done later at Bayview Station revealed that the female had had numerous narcotics and prostitution arrests and convictions.

Monday, February, 5, 2007 - 1:13 PM - Warrant Arrest, Narcotics Offense - Evans Avenue and Mendell Street - CS# 070 130 132 - Officers Izaguirre and Tierrafria were on patrol when they observed a car traveling at a high rate of speed and weaving in and out of traffic on Evans Street. They pulled the car over and learned that the driver, on probation in San Mateo County, had an outstanding warrant for his arrest. The warrant also from San Mateo County, is for narcotics. A search of the vehicle revealed a mouthwash bottle containing suspected heroin. The man was booked for traffic and narcotics violations.

Monday, February 5, 2007 - 9:56 PM - Found Property - Double Rock Housing Projects - CS# 070 132 172 - Three guns were taken off the street thanks to Officers Batchelder and Wise. While these officers were performing a traffic stop they observed a group of men standing next to a Chevrolet El Camino. During their traffic stop the men all walked away from the Chevrolet. The officers advised the motorist and went to investigate the

El Camino. They saw that there were several bullet holes in the El Camino and the driver's side window was smashed. In the rear floorboard of the El Camino was a 9mm pistol.

Additional units were summoned to the scene and the area searched for the men that were standing next to the car. Behind one of the buildings in a planter box was an assault rifle and a sawed off shotgun.

The El Camino was towed for investigation. The guns were collected and are going to be processed for DNA.

Tuesday, February 8, 2007 - 12:40 PM - Possession of a Firearm, Parole Violation - Double Rock Projects - CS# 070 141 571 - Plainclothes officers, acting on a tip, were on patrol in the Double Rock Housing Projects. They received information that a person in connection with another violent crime was in the area with a gun. Plainclothes officers saw the man in the passenger seat of a passing car. They stopped the car and took both occupants into custody. In the rear of the car were a shotgun and a box of ammunition. Both men were booked for weapons related charges. Additionally, the passenger of the car is on parole.

Sunday, February 11, 2007 - 9:29 AM - Cultivating Marijuana, Possession of a Firearm - 1500 block of LaSalle - CS# 070 152 142 - Officers Barcojo and Bandvik responded to a residence on the 1500 block of LaSalle Avenue on an alarm activation. As they arrived a man who identified himself as a friend of the resident drove up and told the Officers that he had a key. The Officers asked the friend if he wanted them to do a walkthrough and he said yes. They searched the unit and found a large marijuana growing operation. They detained the friend and locked down the unit. The officers notified the narcotics division and Bayview's plainclothes officers. A search warrant for the home was obtained.

A larger search of the house was performed and in addition to all the growing materials and marijuana the officers found a loaded handgun in the room of the resident. Incidentally, a PG&E bill was found that had monthly charges of over \$800.00. The owner of the house was away and his flight was due to arrive back in San Francisco this evening.

The plainclothes officers coordinated with SFPD Airport Bureau to confirm whether or not the property owner was on the flight. When the flight arrived the property owner was taken into custody.
