Crimes and Law Enforcement

THE BELOW LISTED INCIDENTS WERE SUBMITTED BY INDIVIDUALS OF BAYVIEW STATION:

SUNDAY 11/19/2006, 5:30PM, 1700 block of Oakdale Ave - Domestic Violence Arrest (Case# 061234917)

Officers Erb, Spain, Johnson, and Blount responded to a report of an aggravated assault on Oakdale Ave to find the victim with a cut and swollen lip. The victim told them he had been fixing dinner in his mother's apartment when his mother's boyfriend began mocking him by repeating everything he said. When the victim protested, an argument began and led to a fight. The suspect punched the victim in the face and threw him against a table, and the victim grabbed his mother's cane to defend himself. They had been drinking... Fortunately, the suspect stayed at the scene and was arrested. He was booked into custody at Bayview Station. The victim was transported to the hospital to be treated for his injuries.

SUNDAY 11/19/2006, 7:11PM, 100 block of Ruel Ct - False Personation, Parole Warrant Arrest (Case # 061235272)

Officers Cruz and Festa were dispatched to Ruel Court in response to a 911 caller's report that a fight was going on in an apartment there. The caller reported that a man was in her mother's apartment "tearing it up." When Ofc Cruz and Festa arrived they were met at the door to the apartment by the mother. She told them that she and her boyfriend had gotten into an argument and that her boyfriend had thrown "Koolaid" all over her, but that she was otherwise unhurt. The victim said that she had gotten upset and called her daughter, who then telephoned the police. She also happened to mention that her boyfriend, who was still inside, had a Parole Warrant out for his arrest. As she let them into the apartment she tactfully mentioned to Ofc Cruz and Festa that her boyfriend regularly uses his brother's name to avoid being arrested on the warrant and told them his real name.

When Ofc Cruz and Festa met with the man inside and asked for his ID he

sadly replied that he didn't have his wallet with him, but he cheerfully lied right to their face and gave them his brother's name and date of birth. At that moment, the victim came in and handed Ofc Cruz the man's wallet. Ofc Cruz pulled out the man's ID card, which had not only his brother's name and information on it, but it even had his brother's picture - the picture on the ID card was NOT the man who was standing in front of them insisting that it was actually him.

Which was when the victim came back into the room with the man's REAL ID card. A quick computer check showed that the man did indeed have a warrant out for his arrest.

Ofc Cruz and Festa placed the man under arrest and booked him into custody at Bayview Station.

TUESDAY 11/21/2006, 7:45AM, 100 block Commer Ct - Child Endangerment Arrest (Case # 061240340)

When Ofc Bandvik heard the radio call about a child wandering around Commer Court with no clothing on he hit the gas and responded immediately.

When he got there he found a little girl in the care of a good Samaritan. The woman told Ofc Bandvik that she had looked out of the window and saw the little girl who lived next door wandering around alone with nothing but her panties on. The woman said that she went out and took charge of her. She said that she had gone to the girl's house to find her mother; she found the door unlocked but no one was home. She then called the police.

Ofc Bandvik asked the little girl where her mother was. The girl said that she had woken up in her house alone and that she didn't know where her mother was.

At that moment her mother arrived. Mom told Ofc Bandvik that she had had to work the night before but she had arranged for a babysitter to stay over with her daughter for the night until she came home from work. Ofc Bandvik checked the apartment for the babysitter but no one was there.

Ofc Bandvik did a little research and was able to find out the babysitter's address and phone number. He called her and she agreed to meet him at her home. When he met with her she told him that she had left the apartment to go get breakfast for herself and the child. Ofc Bandvik then arrested the babysitter for child endangerment.

The babysitter was booked into custody at County Jail.

Threats, Domestic Violence Arrest (Case #061254686)

Ofc Darnell was working the front desk at Bayview Station when the woman came to the counter and told him that her ex-boyfriend had threatened to kill her.

She told him that she and her boyfriend had been dating for several years but that they had broken up a week ago when they had been arguing and he punched her in the face - after that she was through with him.

The woman told Ofc Darnell that she had been on Westpoint Road when her ex came up to her and told her that he was going to shoot her to death. The woman said that she believed the man had the means to shoot her, because she had seen him playing with a pistol at his apartment weeks before. She gave Ofc Darnell a description of the gun and the suspect's address.

Ofc Darnell contacted Bayview Housing Officers Dockery and Robinson, who work in the Westpoint Road housing developments, and told them about the incident. Ofc Dockery and Robinson tracked the man down and placed him under arrest for terrorist threats and domestic violence.

The man was booked into custody at Bayview Station. This arrest is just another example of the cooperation between the officers at Bayview Station and their zeal for getting the bad guy.

Sunday, November 26, 2006 - 4:44 PM - Homicide Arrest Warrant - 2000 Block of Wawona - CS# 060 274 924 - Bayview Officers received information that a person wanted for murder was hiding out in the Outer Sunset. Officers Coleman, Kirchner, Lyons, Rightmire, and Gasanyan under the direction of Sgt. Hagan patrolled the area looking for him. The officers spotted a car on Noriega and 46th Avenue and saw that the suspect was in the passenger seat. The vehicle sped off turned down Sunset Boulevard. The car turned left on Wawona Street and stopped. The suspect got out of the car and ran. However, he was caught by Officers Rightmire and Gasanyan and booked at County Jail.

Sunday, November 26, 2006 - 4:45 PM - Robbery with a Gun - Donner and Ingalls - CS# 061 258 371 - Officers Whitfield and Norris, reported that two men that were working on their car were robbed by at gunpoint by a masked man. Unbeknownst to the suspect a witness saw the crime unfold. The witness saw the suspect get out of a tan SUV and heard the suspect tell the driver where to park the car. The suspect donned a ski mask and approached the victims. The suspect fled the area and the SUV followed him.

The SUV was found by additional units in the Double Rock Housing Project.

While the call was being dispatched, Plainclothes Officers were in the area and spotted two people running away from the area that matched the description. A chase ensued and the youths ran into Double Rock Housing Projects. The two were quickly caught. The victim was brought to the scene and he positively identified one of the suspects as his attacker. The man, now a Oakland resident, was booked on robbery related charges.
