I expect that there will be a number of individuals present who will express their general displeasure with the SFPD, and their specific displeasure with my officers. (It is quite common for groups such as "Cop Watch" from Berkeley, as well as the local ACLU chapter, to attend these meetings and articulate what they believe are the myriad failings of the department.)
