#### Police Budget Hearings

The Fiscal Staff of the Police Department will be appearing before the Board of Supervisors on June 22nd, and again on June 29th. They are slated for the early sessions, which take place between 10:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. each day. If you would like to be participate in this process, which affects everything from our staffing levels to our training funds, you may wish to attend either or both sessions.

#### Bayview Transportation Improvement Project

The Department of Public Works, in partnership with the Planning Department, invites community members to attend an ad hoc Community Advisory Meeting for the Bayview Transportation Improvements Project. The meeting will focus on proposed truck route alternatives. The meeting will take place June 27, from 5:30 to 6:30 p.m. at the Southeast Community Facility, 1800 Oakdale Avenue.

#### Crime and Enforcement Update

Warrant Arrest, 1908 Keith, June 16, 10:23 a.m.

Bayview Officers Hurley and Barron responded on a call of two men dealing drugs and found and detained two men matching the description given. One of the men provided the officers with a fictitious name, and he was brought to the station pending further identification. An officer in the station recognized the man and provided his actual name, and it was determined that he had an outstanding warrant. The man, living on Matthews Court, was booked for a warrant charging him with possession of cocaine (050 672 029).

Check Fraud, 2675 San Bruno, June 16, 12:28 p.m.

Bayview Officer Hui responded to the Bank of the West and spoke with an employee who reported that a man had attempted to cash a stolen and fraudulent check. The man, living in Oakland, had fled prior to the arrival of the officer, but he left his California ID card behind (050 672 461).

Employee Theft, 555 23rd Street, June 16, 2:02 p.m.

Bayview Officer Cohen spoke with an employee at DHL Express who reported that a temporary employee had been caught on security cameras loading property (which was not part of his actual delivery) onto his truck. The specific item stolen, a television, can be seen on the video being loaded by the employee. The employee, living on Quesada, will be interviewed by police inspectors (050 672 734).

Threats, 34 Dakota, June 16, 2:30 p.m.

A woman came to Bayview Station and reported that her ex-boyfriend, who is currently in county jail awaiting trial in a domestic violence case, sent her a threatening letter. The woman provided the letter, which was booked as evidence, in which the ex-boyfriend threatens her and writes some additional very rude comments. The case is being forwarded to the district attorney handling the current case for which the suspect is already in jail (050 673 522).

Possession Cocaine, 1175 Oakdale, June 16, 4:13 p.m.

Bayview Officers Izaguirre, DeJesus, Mustafich and Solares were on patrol when they saw four known locals loitering on public housing property. The young men took off running upon seeing the officers and were detained after a short foot chase. One of the men told officers that he had some crack in his pocket, but that it didn't belong to him. The young man, 15 and living on the 1400 block of LaSalle, was taken to YGC and booked for possession of crack cocaine and trespassing on public housing property (050 673 384).

Robbery, Wisconsin and 25th, June 16, 4:16 p.m.

Bayview Officer Fowlie spoke with a male who reported that on June 13, at approximately 9:00 p.m., he exited a Muni bus and was approached from behind by a suspect who struck him in the head and knocked him to the ground. The victim stated that several additional suspects then joined the original suspect and they went through his pockets, stealing his property. The suspects were never seen and could not be described (050 673 378).

Robbery, 421 Hamilton, June 16, 7:19 p.m.

Bayview Officers Chu and Rodriguez responded on a gun robbery call and spoke with the male caller who reported that he had just been robbed at gunpoint while walking home. The suspects had pulled up in a dark red, 2 door, American made late 80's vehicle, and two of them exited the car and pointed a gun at the victim, demanding his property. Suspect one is a black male, 21-25, driving the vehicle. Suspect two is a black male, 5'8", 150, wearing a black jacket and black T-shirt. Suspect three is a black male, rear passenger in the auto (050 674 047).

Warrant Arrest, 3rd and Newcomb, June 16, 7:46 p.m.

Bayview Officers Coleman and Wilhelm responded on a robbery call in which three suspects had been described fleeing in a red car. En route to the call, the officers saw a red car with three men on board and stopped it. The men were not involved in the robbery, but the driver was found to have an outstanding warrant. The driver, living on Diamond Heights, was booked for a warrant charging him with stolen auto and possession of stolen property (050 674 188).

Aggravated Assault on a Peace Officer, 4700 3rd Street, June 16, 11:34 p.m.

Bayview Officers Erb and Johnson were on patrol when they saw a vehicle driving recklessly in the area of Newcomb, Newhall and 3rd Streets. The officers attempted to stop the vehicle, but it took off at a high rate of speed and was lost in the area. Several other Bayview units saw this vehicle (yellow Mustang) in the area and tried to stop it, but each time it took off at a high rate of speed and failed to stop. As the officers drove past Newcomb and Newhall they saw the vehicle driving toward them, with its headlights out, and the vehicle suddenly crossed into the wrong lane and drove directly toward the officers, who were forced to swerve out of their lane to avoid contact. The vehicle again took off and was lost in the area. The officers eventually saw the vehicle double-parked outside the Bayview Liquors Store at 3rd and Newcomb and saw the driver walk into the store. The officers approached the driver and attempted to arrest him, but he resisted violently. The man, living in Antioch, was eventually brought under control and booked for two counts of aggravated assault on a peace officer, felony evading, two counts of resisting arrest, and numerous

traffic offenses. The vehicle was impounded since the driver was driving with a suspended license (050 674 592).

Stolen Auto Arrest, 787 Dartmouth, June 17, 12:10 a.m.

Bayview Officers Madrid and Kenny responded on a call of a suspicious vehicle and stopped a vehicle matching the description provided. The driver of the vehicle was 15 and admitted to officers that he had no license. The officers ran the rear plate and found it to be a stolen license plate. The front plate was also reported as stolen, and the vehicle's ID showed that it too was stolen. The thief had apparently stolen a license plate from another car and placed it over the issued license, not expecting the owner of the stolen plate to report it so quickly. The young man, living on the 700 block of Dartmouth, was booked for stolen auto, possession of stolen property, possession of burglar tools, and various traffic offenses. He was also booked for an outstanding arrest warrant charging him with robbery (050 665 046).
