April 26, 2009-Warrant Arrest, False Identification to a Police Officer, Juvenile in danger of leading immoral life-7:56am-Williams Avenue-CN#090434970:

Officers Pai and Seto responded to Williams St regarding a subject who had a warrant for her arrest. Officers located the subject in a back room of a house. The subject had no identification on her and lied about her name. Officers transported her to Bayview Station where they confirmed her name via our computer system and placed her under arrest for the warrant.

April 25, 2009-Stolen Property, Recovered Motorcycle-11:12-1500 blk of McKinnon-CN#090432128:

Officer Cota and Training Officer Mazur were driving in the area of Underwood and Jennings when they received information from the on-board tracking system, that there was a stolen vehicle in the area. Officer Byrne advised that he was receiving a lo-jack hit in the area of Newcomb and Mendell and was detaining two subjects. Officers located the stolen motorcycle inside of a large van. In the subsequent investigation, the officers identified the suspect and placed him under arrest.

Members of Bayview's housing team responded to Cameron Way regarding an assault incident. The officers spoke to the mother of the victim, who stated that one of her daughters was assaulted by a suspect. The victim told officers that the suspect punched her numerous times, until she fell to the ground and that this was the second time the suspect had assaulted her. The victim also stated that she was going to get a restraining order against the suspect. Officers searched for the known suspect, to no avail.

Members of Bayview's housing team responded to the area of Egbert Avenue and Hawes regarding a shooting. Lt. Connolly, who was the first unit on scene, reported that a car had bullet holes in it. Officer Adamson located a victim who told officers that he was shot at by three juvenile subjects that were on top of a hillside, shooting down at him. Officers hiked up the hill, but did not locate anyone. The victim was not injured during the incident.

April 26, 2009-Theft from person, Malicious Mischief, Vandalism to a car-1:35pm-Kirkwood Avenue-CN#090435865:

Officers Hernandez and Whitney responded to Kirkwood regarding a call of numerous juveniles throwing rocks at people. Officers spoke to a witness, who said that she was in her backyard, cleaning up glass from the last time juveniles threw rocks at her, when the same group started throwing rocks again. The victim stated that she was not injured during the incident, but that the suspects left the area before police arrived. Officers searched the area, to no avail.

Members of Bayview's housing team responded to the area of Middlepoint regarding a bullet through a wall. The next morning she noticed that there was a bullet hole through her closet door and through the wall in the living room. Officers also recovered a bullet from the victims' floor. The bullet was booked as evidence. No one was injured during the shooting.

Officers Cummins and Rodriguez responded to a report of a strong-arm robbery. The victim refused. At that point all three occupants got out of the car, surrounded the victim, punching, slapping and pulling her hair. The suspects then took the victim's cell phone, id card, bag and money. The suspects got back into their car and left the area. The victim stated that she was not seriously injured and that she would get her own medical help. Officers did not locate the suspects.

April 28, 2009-Warrant Arrest, Enroute to Dept of Corrections-12:27pm-Nichols Way-CN#090442503:

Members of Bayview's Housing Team were in the area of Nichols Way when they saw a subject loitering in a high crime area. Officers detained the subject and discovered an outstanding warrant for his arrest. Officers placed the subject under arrest, without incident and transported him to Bayview Station.

April 28, 2009-Discharging Firearm in a Grossly Negligent Manner, Firearm w/altered identification-Firearm possession in School Zone-

Members of Bayview's Plainclothes Team were in the area of Whitney Young Circle when they saw a subject riding a dirt bike without wearing a helmet. Officers followed the bike on foot, but lost it. Moments later, the officers heard gun shots and responded to the area. Officer Kirchner saw a suspect who ran from him and dumped the gun. Officers Nastari, from Narcotics, located the gun, the suspect's sweatshirt, batting gloves and cell phone. Officer Mason, from the Tactical Unit, located the suspect hiding in a backyard. Officer Mason placed the suspect into custody and seized several items of evidence on him. Officers determined through their investigation, that the suspect was the shooter and owner of the gun. Inspector Broberg, with Gang Task Force, responded and took over the investigation.

April 27, 2009-Carrying Concealed Weapon, Resisting Police-4:16pm-1900 blk of Oakdale-CN#091172667:

Members of Bayview's Plainclothes Team responded to a "Shot Spotter" activation in the area of Oakdale Avenue. Numerous officers also responded to the area regarding a possible suspect that may have fired a gun in front of a Youth Center. Officers Lyons, Scott and Sgt. Hagan located two men who matched the descriptions given by other officers and attempted to contact them. One of the suspects ran from officers as soon as officers got out of the car. The suspect also threw a handgun underneath a MUNI bus. Officer Lyons was able to corner the suspect and take him into custody. Lyons recovered the weapon and took custody of it. Officers located a second suspect, who also tried to run from officers. Officer Kirchner, resident gun expert, determined that the gun recovered had been fired. No one was injured during the shooting. Both suspects were transported back to Bayview Station for further investigation and processing.
