ARRESTS OF INTEREST:

March 29, 2009-Possession of Firearm by a Prohibited Person, Possession of Loaded Firearm, Warrant Arrest-7:10pm-Las Villas Ct-CN#090329393:

Members of Bayview's plainclothes team were in the area of La Villas Court when they witnessed a car backing up the wrong way down a hill. Officers drove towards the car to investigate and came upon several subjects standing in front of a house that had just been the focus of a successful search warrant. One subject, who Officer Kirchner knew from prior arrests and contacts, ran when he saw Kirchner approaching. Officers Kirchner and Sanders took the suspect into custody a short time and distance later. Officer Rodatos located a gun in front of the door, where the suspect had been standing before running from officers. The suspect was placed under arrest and transported to Bayview Station.

Officers Kwan and Soares responded to an aggravated assault that had just occurred on 3rd St. Officers located the suspect, who had blood on his shirt. Members of Bayview's plainclothes team were shown pictures of two robbery suspects by an Inspector from the Robbery Detail. Officer Scott recognized one of the suspects from a prior firearm arrest. The inspector told officers to try and locate the suspect and arrest him. Officers responded to an address and located the suspect, also finding suspected narcotics, a firearm and numerous items of evidence that was taken and/or used during the robberies. Officers also found and arrested the second suspect in the robbery.

March 27, 2009-Battery of a Police Officer, Resisting, Delaying Peace Officers-10:30am-600 blk of Colby-CN#090320379:

Officers Catlett and Oropeza responded to Colby St regarding a trespasser, who was attempting to force a front gate and a garage door open. Officers had the suspect sitting down, due to his large size of 6ft, 330 pounds, when the suspect stood up and advanced towards Officer Catlett, screaming obscenities and throwing a punch in Catlett's direction. The punch missed its mark and Officer Catlett used pepper spray on the suspect. In the subsequent struggle, the suspect lost his balance and fell on top of Officer Whitney. Whitney was not seriously injured during the incident. The suspect was transported to SFGH and then booked. No entry was made into the premise by the suspect.

INCIDENTS OF INTEREST

March 30, 2009-Arson of Vehicle-12:30pm-700 blk of Jamestown-CN#090330152:

Officers Alvaranga, Gummo and Talusan responded to Jamestown regarding a report of an arson. Officers met with the SFFD who stated that the car had been deliberately set on fire. SFFD found the car fully engulfed in flames and put the fire out immediately. No one was injured during the fire. The owner of the vehicle was notified. The car was towed and held for an Arson Investigator.

Officer McKelley took a report at Bayview Station regarding an assault. Officer McKelley met with the victim, who stated that she was walking with her one year old child, on the street, when a person that she knows attacked her, pushing her to the ground and punching and kicking her all over the body. Numerous citizens stepped in and grabbed the child to protect her. Another unknown person also pulled the suspect off the victim. The victim walked to her car with her child when the suspect threw a bottle at the victim, hitting her in the hand. The child was not harmed. Officers were unable to locate the suspect and the incident is under investigation.

Bldg-1:43AM-1000 blk of Oakdale-CN#090323210: March 28, 2009-Firearm, Discharging at Unoccupied

Officers Gummo and Kavanagh responded to Oakdale Avenue regarding a report of shots being fired. Officer met with Security who stated that he heard shots fired and saw a car speed away from the scene. Officers responded to an address where they found bullet holes in the house. Officers also found another car with gun shot damage. No suspects were located and no one was injured during the shooting.

March 28, 2009-Robbery w/gun-1:33AM-Palou/Phelps-CN#090870261:

Officers Masilang and Doherty responded to Palou and Phelps regarding a shooting. Officers located a shooting victim at SFGH. The victim told officers that he was standing with friends at the corner of Palou waiting for the bus, when two unknown suspects approached them with a gun and demanded money. The

suspects pushed and shoved the victim and his friends, patting them down for money. The suspects then shot one victim several times. A passerby took the victim to the hospital where he was listed in stable condition. No one else was injured during the shooting. Officers were unable to locate the suspects. The Robbery Detail took over the investigation.

March 26, 2009-Robbery w/gun-12:03am-600 blk of Hamilton-CN#09031151:

Police Service Aid, Orkes, took a report from a victim, who stated that he was robbed. The victim further explained that he parked his car in front of his cousin's house when two unknown suspects approached him and pointed a gun at his head. The suspects demanded money from the victim, which he gave them. The victim also gave the suspects a wallet, sunglasses and eyeglasses. The suspects then ran up the street. Officers were unable to locate the suspects.

March 27, 2009-Aggravated Assault w/gun, Shooting into an Inhabited Dwelling-9:38pm-Double Rock/Cameron-CN#090322563:

Officer Buchanan and Sgt. Cruz responded to the area of Gilman Ave regarding a shots fired call. Officer Johnson located a victim who had been shot. The victim told Officers that he was driving home with two friends when they became lost and found themselves inside of the Double Rock gated area. The victim drove to the dead end and was turning around to leave, when an unknown suspect fired shots into the victim's car, hitting the victim several times. Officers searched the area for the suspect, to no avail. The victim was transported to SFGH, where he was treated and later released. No one else was injured during the shooting.
