September 18, 2009-Attempted Assault w/knife-9am-2000 blk of San Bruno Ave-CN#090730992:

Officer Lee responded to the 2000 block of San Bruno regarding a person that had stabbed another person. Officer Lee located the suspect and detained him. Additional units responded and assisted. Arrests:

Monday, September 21, 2009 – 4:45 PM – Attempted Robbery – 200 block of Cambridge Street – CS# 090 976 201 – Three teenage boys and one teenage girl were arrested after attempting to rob a young woman. The victim told officers that she was getting off the bus on Cambridge Street and Silver Avenue. As she got to the door of her house, the female suspect approached her and demanded her iPod. Arrests:
