Officers Thompson and Cheng responded to Hollister St regarding a fight on a MUNI bus. While en route, the officers were advised by dispatch that the mother of the victim was calling to advise that the bus was stopped at Ingerson and Hawes and that she was on her way. Officers met with the victim who told them that he was robbed by two subjects who he knows. The victim further stated that one of the subjects punched him in the nose and took the chain from around his neck. The victim got off the bus and was again, confronted by the two suspects. Another victim was also beaten up by another suspect when she attempted to protect our victim. Both victim's refused medical treatment and were not seriously injured.

Later, Officers from the Housing Unit, who are familiar with the two suspects went looking for them. Officers located one of the suspects and had his mother bring him from school to Bayview Station. Officers contacted a Robbery Inspector who stated that it was not yet confirmed that the suspect should be taken into custody. Officers had the suspect complete a statement and released him to the custody of his mother pending further investigation. Officer Lamma also confirmed the identity of the second suspect, who is also under further investigation.

Incidents of Interest:

September 27, 2009-Aggravated Assault, Robbery-1:20am-McKinnon/Newhall-CN#090997558:

Officers Borghesani and Fong responded to a call of a stabbing. Officers spoke with the victim who stated that a person she knew only by the first name, stabbed her with a screwdriver and took her belongings. Officers saw a small stab wound on the top of the victim's hand. Officers called for a medic who responded and treated the victim. The victim further reported that she was sitting in the passenger seat of her friends' car when the suspect walked up and started yelling at her. The suspect reached into the car, grabbed the victim's jacket and proceeded to look through the pockets. The victim got out of the car, attempted to retrieve her belongings and was stabbed in the hand by the suspect. After the attack, the suspect reached into the car again and took the victim's tote bag. Officers searched the area for the suspect, using the information they had regarding the identity of the suspect. Officers were unable to locate the suspect.

area. Officers checked all the residences and the car for any victims, to no avail. Officers Pashby and Maritnez of the Housing Unit, approached a subject who they know to be on parole for weapons, and who may have been involved in the incident. The subject immediately ran from officers, but was apprehended a short distance later. Officers detained the subject and transported him to Bayview Station, where a member of the Gang Task Force cited and released him.

September 25, 2009-Burglary, Unlawful Entry, Possession of stolen checks-9:30am-5000 blk of 3rd st-CN#090990273:

Beat officers Graves and Johnson were dispatched to a bank regarding a subject attempting to cash a fraudulent check. The officers detained a subject, who matched the description and then spoke with the manager of the bank. The manager told officers that the subject gave her a check which was filled out incorrectly and looked suspicious. The manager contacted the owner of the checks and was told that he was missing checks from his house. Officers transported the subject to Bayview Station for further investigation. During a preliminary investigation, Officers discovered that the sister of the suspect had worked for the owner of the checks and had taken them from the owners' house. The suspect was placed under arrest for burglary and booked at Bayview Station.

September 23, 2009-Possession of a gun by a Prohibited Person, Marijuana Offense, Resisting Officers-10:28pm-4000 blk of 3rd st-CN#090985428:

Members of Bayviews plainclothes team were in the area of 3rd and Kirkwood when they heard people yelling, "fucking cops." Officers recognized the person yelling the obscenities and detained him as well as other subjects in the area. Officers attempted to search one of the subjects, but the subject attempted to break away. Officers held fast and searched the subject, locating a shotgun suspended from the suspects' neck. Officers confiscated the shotgun and placed the suspect under arrest. The suspect and the shotgun were

suspects, who continued to spray the mace at them. Officers called for a medic, who responded and treated all the victims at the scene. All victims were released at the scene and did not require hospitalization. Offices searched the area, but did not locate the suspects.

The next day, Officer Peters and Sgt. Hart received new information regarding the suspect, which they used in their investigation to locate the suspect's house. Officers responded to the location and spotted the suspect driving away from the house in the vehicle which was reportedly involved in the incident. Officer Lamma and Officer O'Reilly stopped the vehicle and placed the suspect under arrest, without incident.

September 26, 2009-Firearm, loaded in car, Conspiracy, Juvenile in danger of leading immoral life-10:40am-Ingalls/Harbor-CN#090994877: Officer Benzinger was on patrol, in the area of Harbor and Ingalls, when she stopped a vehicle which failed to stop for a posted stop sign. Several units responded to her location to assist. Through a preliminary investigation, Officer Benzinger discovered that the driver of the vehicle had never been issued a drivers license. Officers removed the driver and other occupants from the vehicle in order to conduct a search prior to towing the car. Officers located a loaded shotgun in the passenger compartment of the car, which they confiscated. Officers placed all three subjects under arrest and transported them to Bayview Station for further investigation. Members of the Gang Task Force responded to Bayview Station and took over the investigation, which resulted in all three suspects being taken to Juvenile Justice Center for booking.

Officers Lee and Ozol responded to the intersection of Shafter and Kieth regarding a report of shots fired in the area. Numerous units responded to the incident and were flagged down by a witness.
